ACCREDITATION



SCCS Student Nationalities




SCHOOL CALENDAR

STANDARDIZED TESTS

In the 2023-2024 school year, 43 seniors participated in SAT test administrations on campus. The average scores for Evidence-Based Reading and Writing for the Class of 2024 was 548 and for Math 531, with 84% meeting the ERW and 64% the Math benchmarks.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The AP program includes SCCS's most rigorous curriculum offerings. Of our students in grades 10–12, 50% were enrolled in at least one of the following AP courses during the 2024-2025 school year:

ADVANCE PLACEMENT EQUITY & EXCELLENCE

In 2024, 91 SCCS students took 189 AP exams: 25% of scores were 4 or above, and 12% were a 5. Students recorded fifteen 5s and thirty-six 4s. 59% of AP test-takers scored 3 or higher. 23 students were named AP scholars: 10 AP scholars, 5 AP scholars with honor and 8 AP scholars with distinction.
