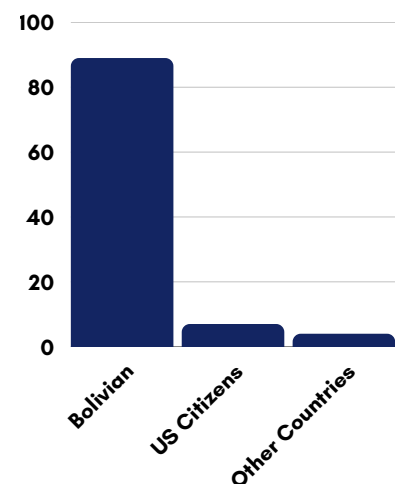

SCCS Student Nationalities



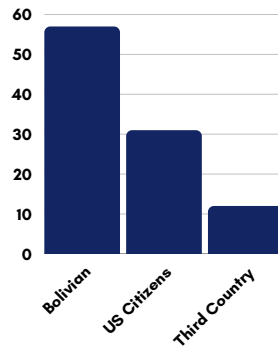


SCHOOL CALENDAR

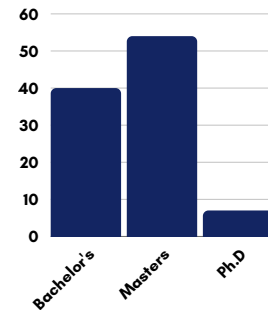

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GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To obtain the Bolivian High School Diploma students must complete the following courses from 9th to 12th grade: Mathematics, English, Spanish Language and Literature, Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Psychology, Philosophy, History, Social Sciences, Civics, Geography, Physical Education, Music, Art, and Ethics/Morality.

STANDARDIZED TESTS

In the 2024-2025 school year, 40 seniors participated in SAT test administrations on campus. The average scores for Evidence-Based Reading and Writing for the Class of 2025 was 563 and for Math 539, with 51% meeting the ERW/Math benchmarks.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The AP program includes SCCS's most rigorous curriculum offerings. Of our students in grades 10-12, 50% were enrolled in at least one of the following AP courses during the 2024-2025 school year:

ADVANCE PLACEMENT EQUITY & EXCELLENCE

In 2025, 103 SCCS students took 192 AP exams: 79% of scores were 4 or above, and 26% were a 5. 35% of AP test-takers scored 3. 23 students were named AP scholars: 13 AP scholars, 3 AP scholars with honor and 5 AP scholars with distinction.
